### Bridging the Gaps for the Tennessee Valley Region

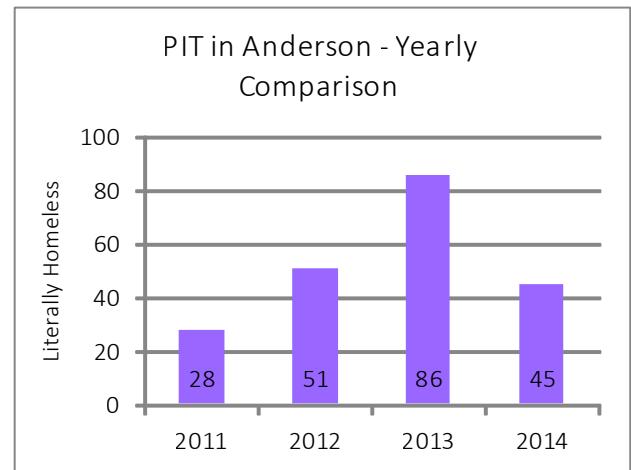
During the Point in Time Count of People Experiencing Homelessness on March, 10, 2014,

(sheltered and unsheltered) and  
35 people were precariously housed (almost homeless)  
in Anderson County.

Shelt-ES: literally homeless in shelter  
Shelt-TH: literally homeless in transitional housing  
Unshelt: literally homeless; living in place not meant for human habitation  
Prec. Hsd: Precariously Housed—almost homeless; living w/others
