

HUD CoC Program Glossary



- > <u>HUD</u> US Department of Housing and Urban Development
- > <u>e-Snaps</u> The online application portal required for all levels of CoC Program applications.
- Collaborative Application The TVCoC Application for funding includes the Project Applications, Collaborative Application questions, and Priority Listing.
- Collaborative Application The CoC designated entity that is responsible for facilitating the local CoC Program Competition and completing all steps of the CoC Program Competition from January through the CoC Program funding opportunity due date.
- > Project Applications Agency application for funding
- <u>Priority Listing</u> The ranked list of projects created by the Rank and Review Committee
- CoC Program Funding A competitive funding stream that supports programming for CoC programs such as Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH and Rapid Rehousing), HMIS, Supportive Services Only, Transitional Housing, and Joint Transitional Housing and Permanent Housing – Rapid Rehousing

HUD CoC Program Glossary



- > <u>NOFO</u> Notice of Funding Opportunity, the document that details all the grant eligibility criteria, requirements, due dates, etc.
- Local Competition Notice Document provided via listserv to all CoC Members detailing a high-level overview of the NOFO
- Local Competition The competitive competition at the local level (TVCoC) where agencies submit their applications, and they are ranked and reviewed for inclusion in the Priority List and Collaborative Application
- Local CoC Program Timeline The timeline created for TVCoC detailing important dates in the local competition
- <u>Bonus Funding</u> Funding available to a CoC outside their Annual Renewal Demand. This funding is awarded based on the score of the Collaborative Application and is a national competition

- > Agency applications due in e-snaps
- The Rank and Review Committee will convene and review individual agency applications to create a priority list of all accepted applications
- Any applications not selected to be included in the Collaborative Application package will be notified in writing
- A draft of the CoC Collaborative Application will be publicly posted on the TVCH webpage for CoC review. All CoC members will be notified when it is posted.
- Collaborative Applicant will submit the Collaborative Application







PIT & HIC Committee



The purpose of the 2025 Point-in-Time count is to produce a point-in-time estimate of people who are experiencing homelessness in the Tennessee Valley CoC's 12-county geographic area. The purpose of the 2025 Housing Inventory Chart (HIC) is to produce an accurate reflection of the CoC's capacity to house homeless and formerly homeless persons.



This committee helps to plan this count each year.

The PIT & HIC Committee is looking for 12 or more individuals from community partners to help with the count in each of their counties to develop the methodologies and process for the 2025 PIT Count, which includes the following responsibilities:

- Recruiting & Training Volunteers
- Develop the Day of the Count Plan
- Provide Volunteer & Count support on the day of the Count
- Turning in their County's Unsheltered Count Summary & Survey Forms

Time Commitment – 20 – 25 hours (over the next 6 months)

- 5 one-hour long Committee Planning Meetings
- 1 Train-the-Trainer Training Session
- Time commitment will increase leading up to the count
- Approximately 8 hours for the night-day of the count

Rank & Review Committee



- Project applications submitted to the CoC for the FY 2024 application cycle must be reviewed and accepted/ ranked, approved, or rejected by the CoC.
- The Rank & Review Committee is looking for 3-5 individuals from community partners to help with the rank and review process for 2024 NOFO, which includes the following responsibilities:
 - Help develop and update TVCoC ranking tools
 - Participate in the review and ranking process
 - Help document scores during the ranking process
 - Submit ranking outcomes to TVCoC membership
- Time Commitment
 - Up to 1 hour/ week leading up to NOFO announcement (typically early to mid-July)
 - 4-6 hours (broken into 2 days) to rank projects as a committee
 - Time commitment will increase during the review week to accommodate the review of all project applications. This can vary depending on each committee member.
