The lack of affordable housing and the increase in inflation rates on basic needs have driven the number of those experiencing homelessness higher and higher in our region. Because of this and the recent extreme cold weather, we had an outpour of folks interested in helping during the count. Our developed partnership over the year also allowed us to lean on our new partners for our volunteer needs. With more volunteers and social services-based experiences, PIT training from years past was improved with more in-depth best practices and the increased number of trainings offered. To entice more agencies to enter HMIS throughout the year, we implemented HMIS for Sheltered Client level data for both our PIT & HIC. Over the year, we grew our partnership base to include more VSP and Transitional Housing organizations that ultimately participated in the PIT & HIC.

This year, we used data from HMIS to conduct the Shelter survey count and compile a list of known locations for the volunteers and case managers to check during the count. We partnered with more agencies that provide nonhousing direct services to people experiencing homelessness but have a vested interest in our work. They were able to help lead the count in smaller areas to ensure all available locations were covered during the count. With the increased number of participants, more PIT training was provided than in previous years.

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
