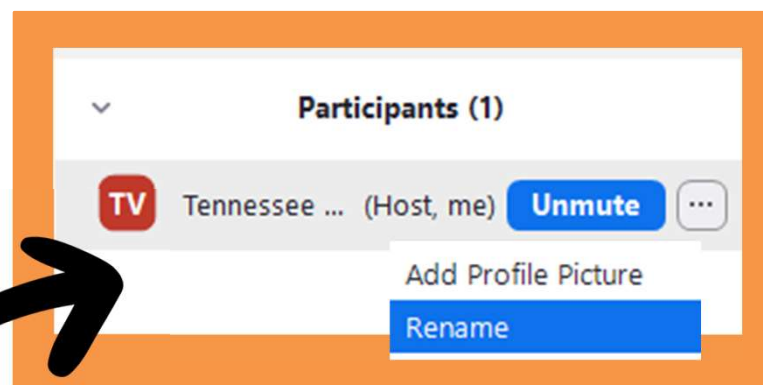

Funding Opportunities

Foundation/Local Grant Opportunities

East Tennessee Endowment Fund

The East Tennessee Foundation's Opportunity Endowment Fund and other ETF unrestricted funds support the capacity building of charitable organizations in our [25-county service area](#) and their ability to collectively address our community's needs. Grants awarded from these funds are to help organizations identify collaborative solutions and utilize partnerships to improve operational, financial, data/information, and programmatic systems so that together, they have a cohesive impact on the community. The Foundation is prioritizing prevention-focused projects which address adverse childhood experiences (ACEs), drivers of health, and early childhood education. Additionally, preference will be given to organizations collaborating together on a shared project.

This fund will accept applications and award grants in two different cycles.

- Cycle 1: Applications open March 31, 2025 and are due June 1, 2025. Grants will be awarded by June 30, 2025.
- Cycle 2: Applications open July 1, 2025 and are due November 30, 2025. Grants will be awarded by December 31, 2025.

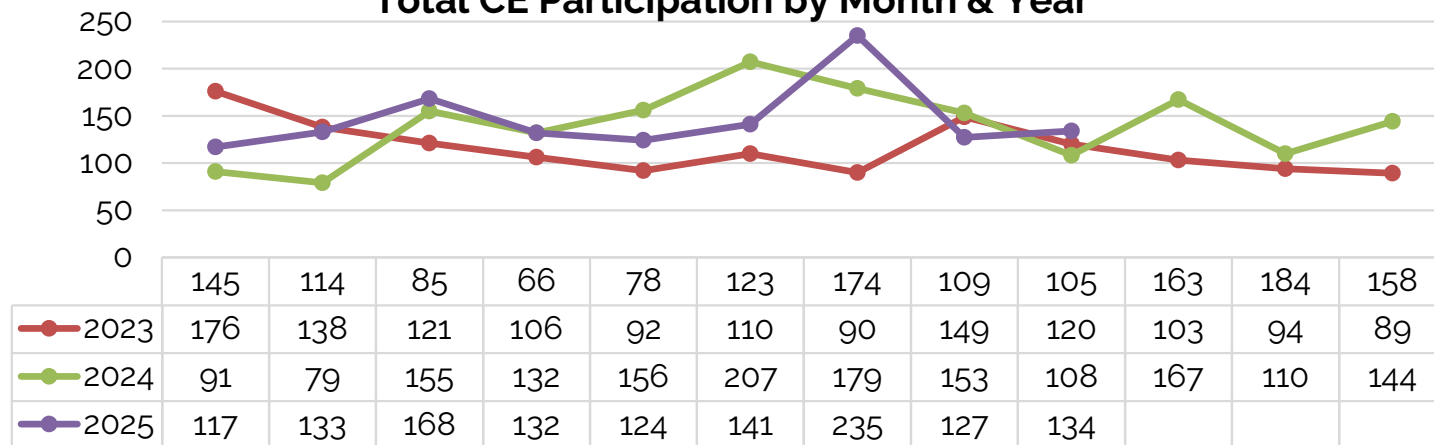

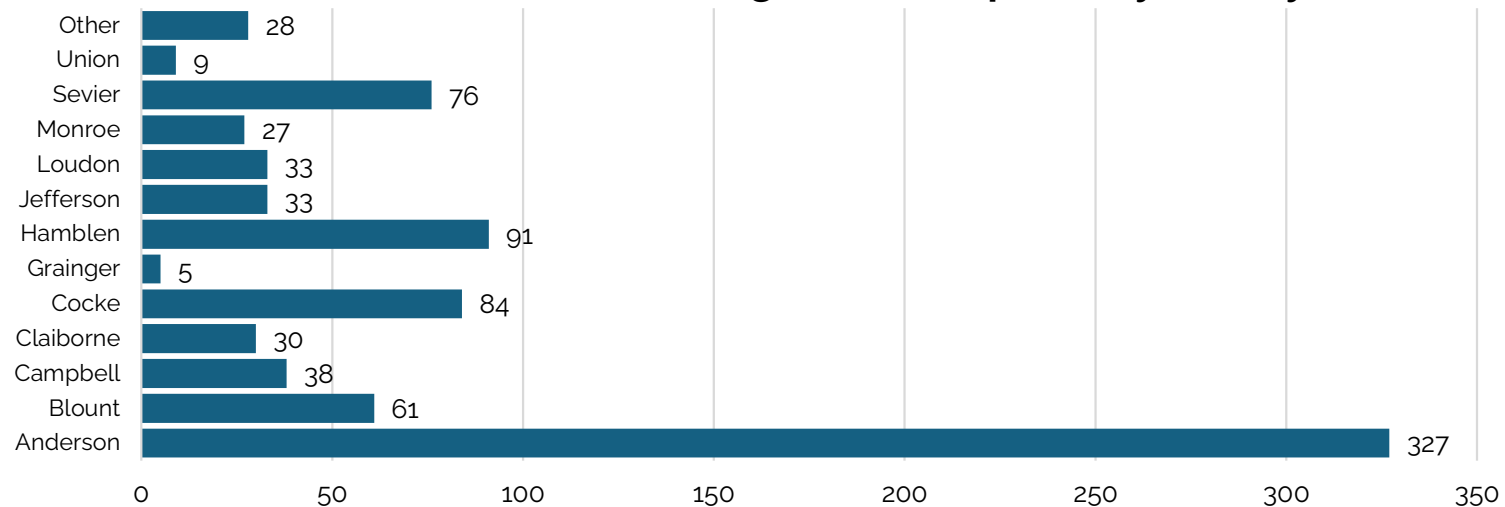

Total CE Participation by Month & Year

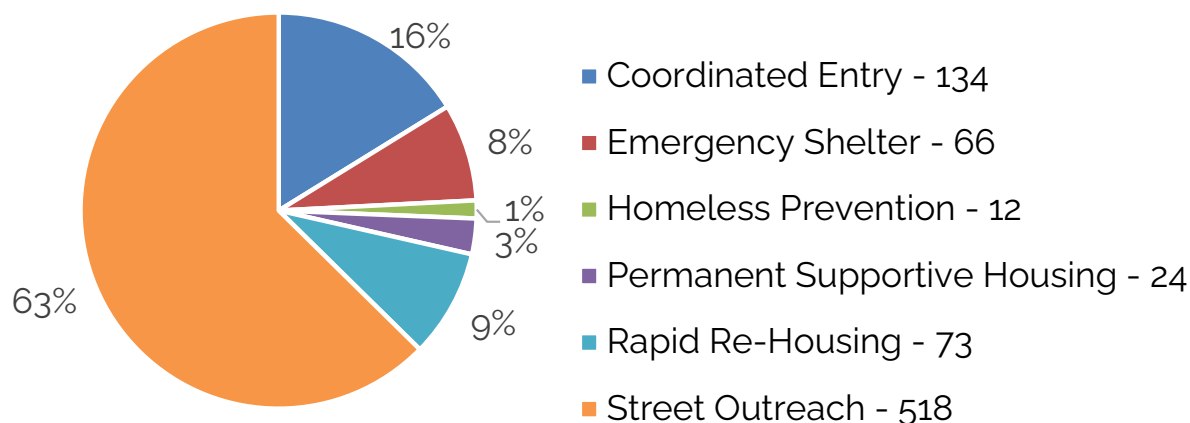


Number of Active Program Participants by County
